Erik and Mark led.

Greg asked for a general financial overview. Mark answered: There is an initial deposit of about \$500 to pay for the Getting it Built Workshop. Going forward, there are continued small contributions between \$500 - \$1000 over the next few months with the largest deposit a few thousand occurring to play for the architecture plans. Over the course of 2 years each family unit would contribute approximately 20% of their total home cost, which would count towards their down payment. Each family would need to secure their own funding, most likely a personal home mortgage to fund the remaining 80%. Some of the initial contributions might be refundable.

Greg asked what the units might cost. Erik answered similar to new construction perhaps \$250-500k. Private units will be smaller than a standard house though because each family owns part of the common house and has access to extra facilities. Kathleen mentioned how our family would have a 3 bedroom home without a guest room and no full basement bonus room.

The timeline for the project is between 2-3 years from now until construction completion and move in.

Greg asked what the best and worst aspects of cohousing are. Erik replied that sometimes it takes 45 minutes to get your mail for the best and the worst. Discussed social norms, you can tell when someone wants to engage and talk. You need to respect privacy. Katherine McWalters told of her experience in an international intentional community that there was a period of adjustment when you learn to set your personal boundaries and learn to respect others' boundaries.

Mark and Kathleen asked for volunteers to help with hanging fliers for the Interest Meeting on May 29 and bringing snacks to share with the public at that event.
